

READ ME FIRST!!!

This template is designed for 24 Hour Comic Book Day with the final project formatted to be a mini comic at 5.5" x 8.5" with a .25" margin around the outside.

I found when doing the 24 Hour Comic Book Day challenge a few times that drawing the art close to actual size (100% printed) made it faster and easier. The templates are a bit larger than 100% which will look nice when reduced down in print. I usually print the templates in color on card stock with a boarderless printing, but as long as they are not smaller beyond the actual size you should be fine. The spread pages might not work the same if the printing is not boarderless, so test first.

This template is free to use, but can not be sold in any form.

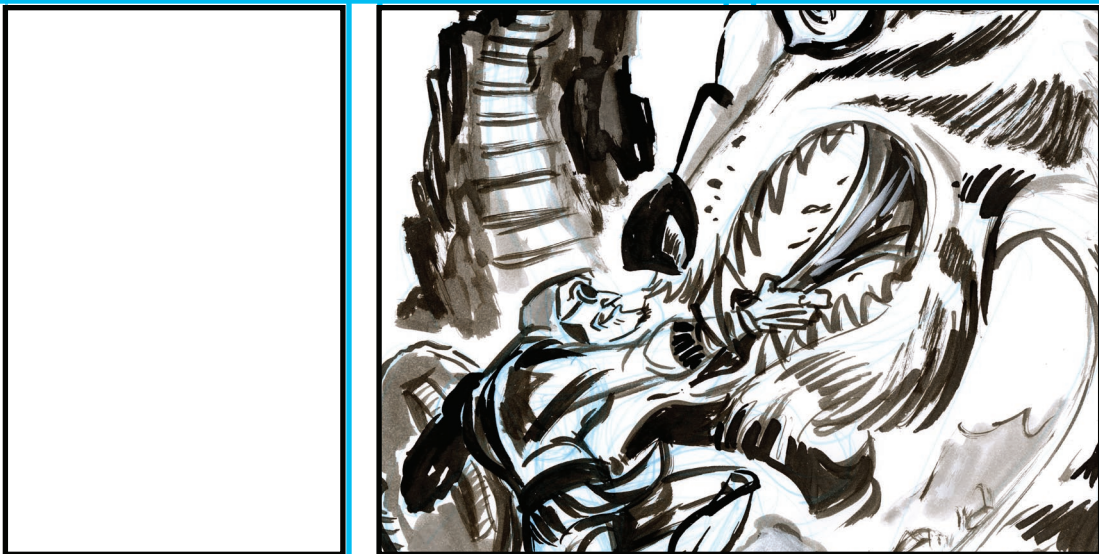

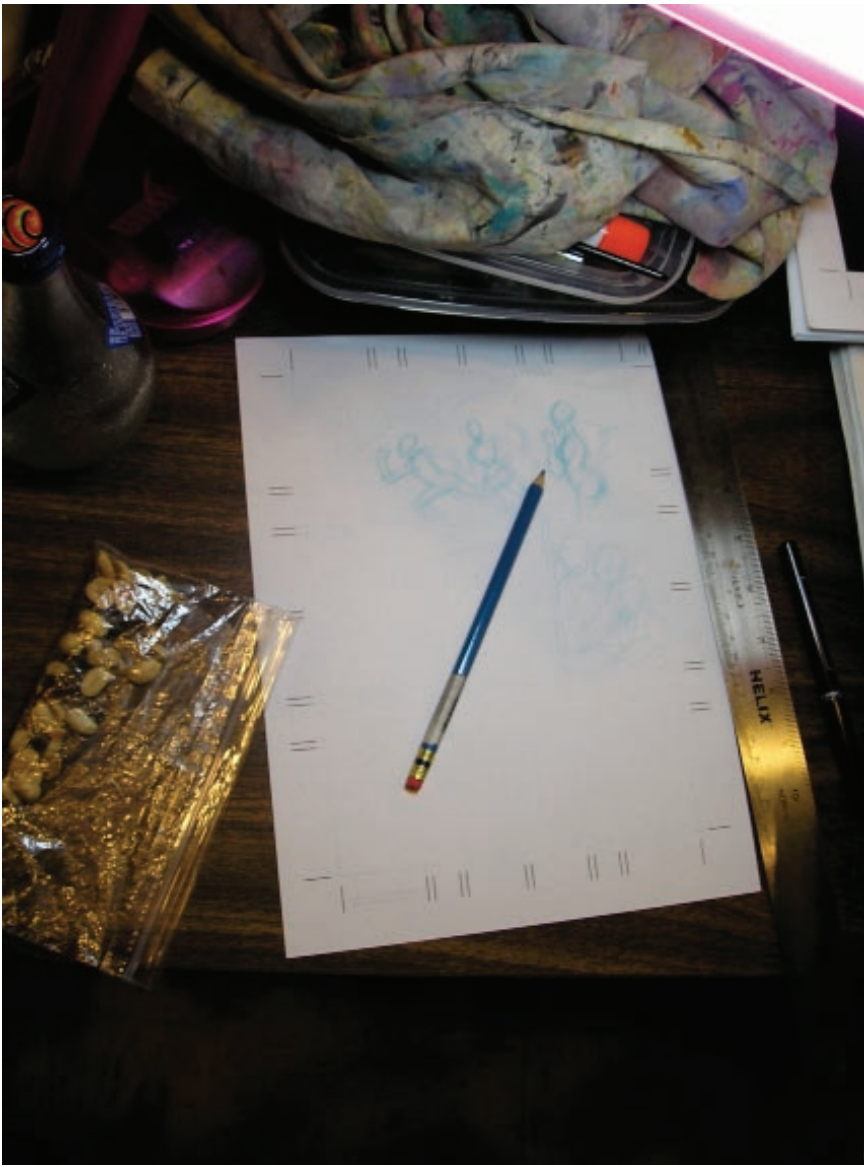
HOW IT WORKS

1) Pencil from the marks on opposite sides to create your panels for your comic. I like to use a non-repo or light blue pencil.

2) Ink the lines you want to keep to make your final page. You might want to pencil and ink the drawings in the boxes first or after, but there is not right or wrong way to do it.

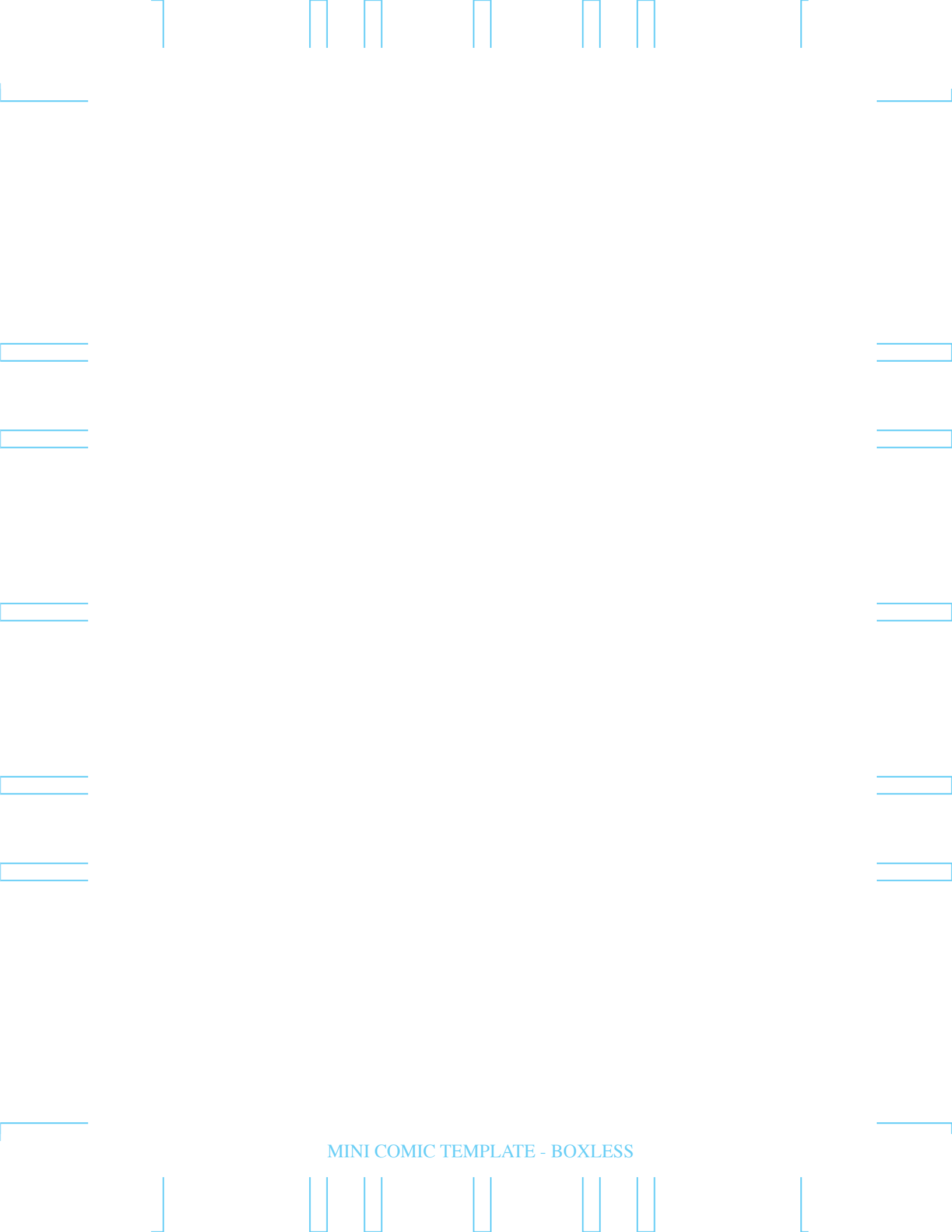

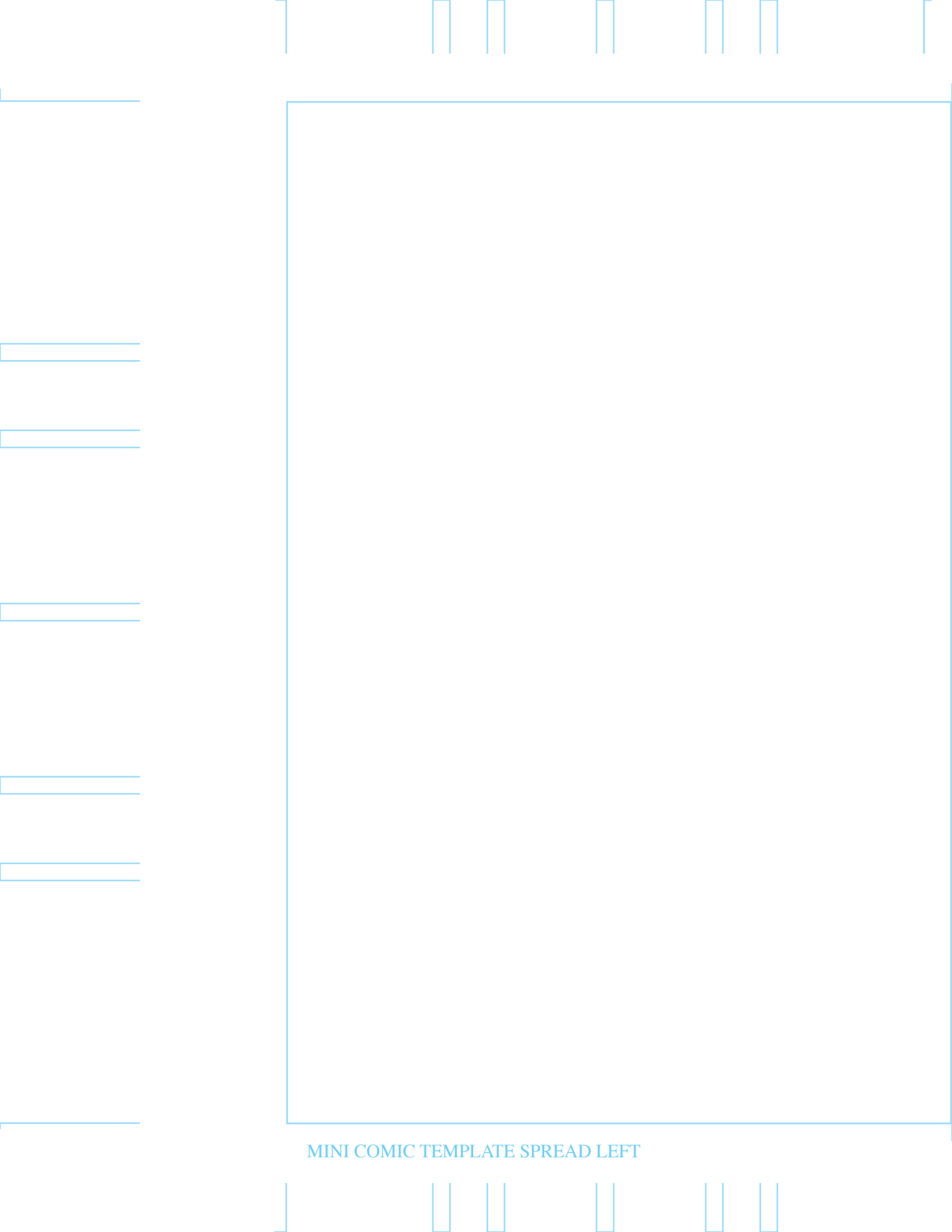




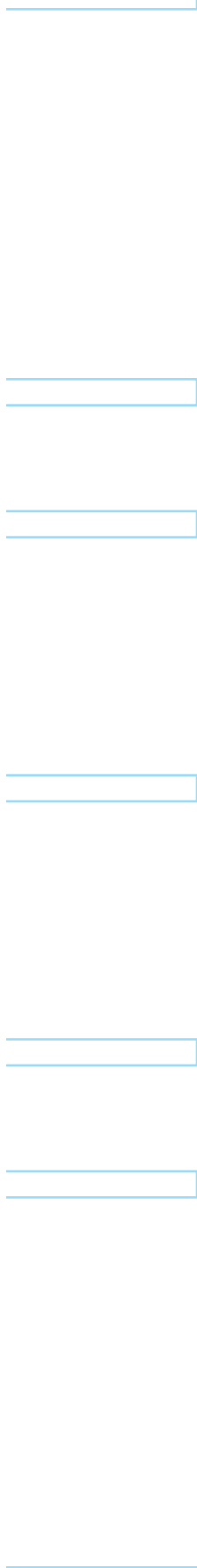
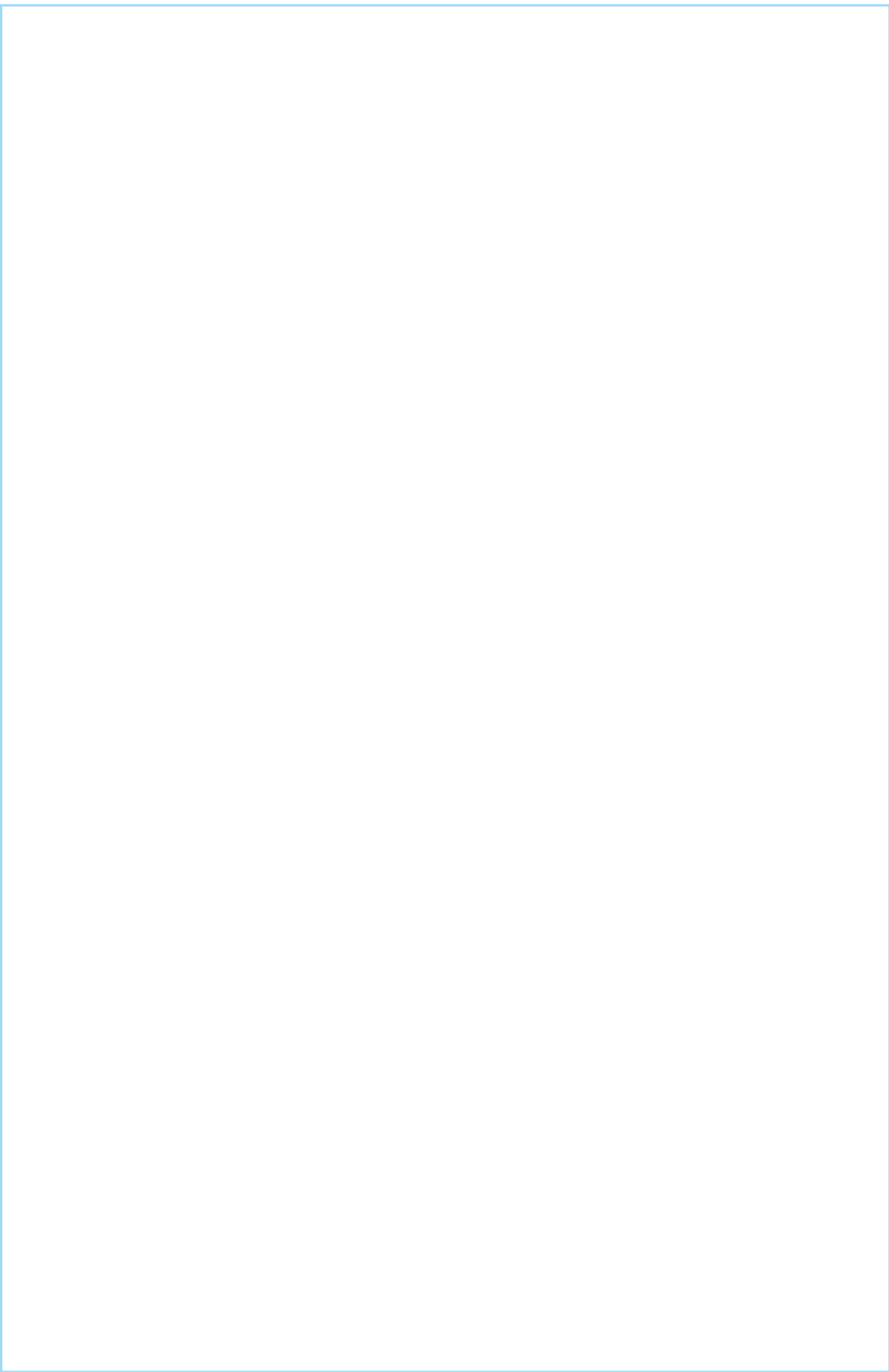
